

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C – Luke): Isaiah, Paul and Peter all experienced the living God although in very different ways. Whether the experience is one of a mystical vision, an appearance of the risen Christ, or a miraculous catch of fish, each of these men finds it a profoundly humbling moment. They all become aware of their own limited and even sinful nature but this is only the first step because each of them, while all too aware of their own weaknesses, knows that they are called to make God known to their contemporaries. The paradox of faith is that it is also the very moment when God makes it known that he needs us.

First Reading (OT): Isaiah 6, 1 – 8: These verses from Isaiah recall the prophet's experience of God in the Jerusalem temple, which led him to offer himself as a preacher of God's word. The date given (the year of King Uzziah's death) is 742 BC and this indicates that the prophet was still quite a young man since we know that his ministry lasted for over forty years. It would seem that, during a liturgy in the temple, Isaiah had a mystical experience of the majesty and glory of God surrounded by the Seraphim which were celestial beings devoted to giving praise to the almighty. Isaiah's immediate response to the divine presence was to become acutely aware of his own sinfulness and to be overwhelmed by the holiness of God. However, in his vision he is cleansed from his sinfulness by the burning coal which touches his lips. Now in this renewed state he hears the voice of God calling out for a messenger and he immediately offers himself. The emphasis in this account is on the holiness of the Lord. He is the transcendent one who is above and beyond all human beings yet who wishes to reveal himself to them and be known by them. The all holy God chooses to need his very limited creatures to make himself known.

Second Reading (NT): 1 Corinthians 15, 1 – 11: In this final section of the letter we have been reading for a few weeks, Paul turns his attention to a problem which some members of the church are having in relation to the resurrection. While people of Jewish background would have had some idea of the resurrection of the dead, it seems that other Christians with a gentile background were casting doubt on the whole idea. Paul begins his answer by stressing that what he had taught them, he himself had first been taught when he came to the faith. This was that Christ died for our sins and that he rose from the dead and appeared to many disciples. This is the steadfast tradition and to it Paul adds his own experience of the risen Christ. There is no doubt in Paul's mind that the teaching on the resurrection of Jesus forms the central core of the faith to which he has devoted his whole life.

Gospel: Luke 5, 1 – 11: Luke links the call of the first disciples with the story of a miraculous catch of fish. In so doing he introduces us not only to Peter but also to the mission of the church. Just as Peter's call comes out of his experience of the power of Christ at work, so too all who wish to be followers of Jesus must come to know that their faith is in a person, Jesus the Son of the living God.
